Background

The website MediaNOLA is a comprehensive wiki of information pertaining to the New Orleans film industry of the 1910's. However, while New Orleans' film history is still relevant to the current day, the time period has had very little exposure, and many don't know New Orleans even had a film industry. Method

Stencyl

Stencyl is a program designed to help those with little programming experience to create their own web and phone games. While some basic programming knowledge is required, Stencyl keeps code organized and allows for click-and-drag level design. The program is free and can be found online.

Edutainment – videogames which both educate and entertain – has been around for decades now. However, Louisiana Lou takes a different approach. By taking the format of a role playing game, Lousiana Lou will allow players in some measure to experience what it was like to live in that time period.
